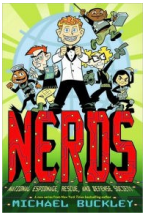




Summer Reading List for Elementary School



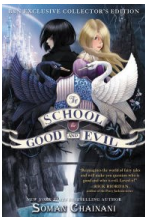
***N.E.R.D.S.* by Michael Buckley—Grades 4—7**

While running a spy network from their elementary school, five unpopular misfits combine their talents and use cutting-edge gadgetry to fight evil around the world.



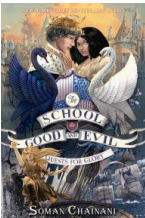
***The Sisters Grimm Series: The Fairy-Tale Detectives* by Michael Buckley—Grades 4—7**

Orphans Sabrina and Daphne Grimm are sent to live with an eccentric grandmother who they have always believed to be dead.



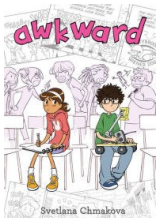
***The School for Good and Evil Series* by Soman Chainani—Grades 5—8**

Jensen's daydreaming gets put to the test by some hard realities when the stresses of middle school get totally out of control.



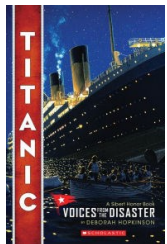
Summerlost by Ally Condie—Grades 5—8

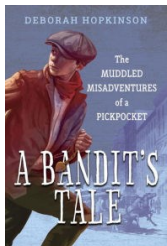
The Darkdeep by Ally Condie and Brendan Reichs—Grades 6—8

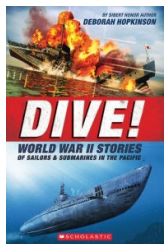
Titanic: Voices from the Disaster by Deborah Hopkinson—Grades 5—8

This book draws on stories from survivors and archival photographs to describe the history of the "Titanic."



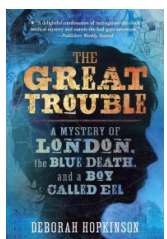
A Bandit's Tale: : the muddled misadventures of a pickpocket by Deborah Hopkinson—Grades 4—7

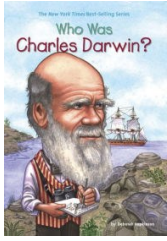
DIVE! World War II Stories of Sailors & Submarines in the Pacific by Deborah Hopkinson—Grades 6—8

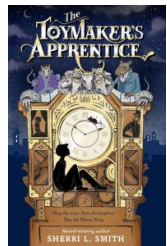
***Who Was Charles Darwin?* by Deborah Hopkinson—Grades 3—7**

This book is an introduction to the life and accomplishments of the nineteenth-century British naturalist Charles Darwin.



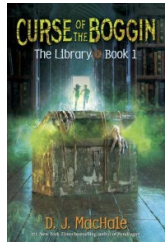
***Who Were the Tuskegee Airmen?* by Sherri L. Smith—Grades 3—7**

This book is an introduction to the men and accomplishments of the Tuskegee Airmen.



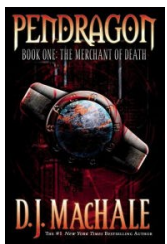
***The Toy Maker's Apprentice* by Sherri L. Smith—Grades 4—6**

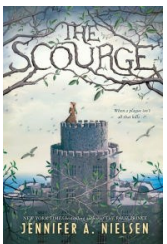
***Curse of the Boggin* by D.J. MacHale—Grades 4—7**

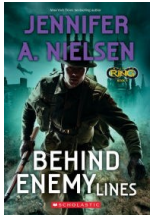
***Pendragon: The Merchant of Death* by D.J. MacHale—Grades 6 and up**

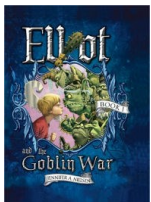
***A Night Divided* by Jennifer A. Nielsen—Grades 5—8**

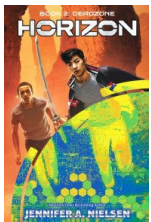
***Resistance* by Jennifer A. Nielsen—Grades 6—8 (Released 8/28/18)**

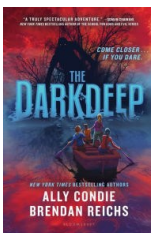
***Elliot and the Goblin War* by Jennifer A. Nielsen—Grades 3—6**
